## Orchid Tip of the Month



## FEELING THE HEAT

July and August can be the toughest and most damaging months to your collection. Many cooler-growing orchids such as masdevallias, lycastes, odontoglossum type oncidiums and even some interme-

diate species struggle this time of year. Many of them can handle the daytime heat, but the real issues develop when temperatures stay warm all night, as happens frequently in our area. Be sensitive to this fact and be prepared to bring some plants back inside to air-conditioned comfort should you experience two-month-long heat waves. Feel the heat on your leaves by touch. A cool leaf is a good sign; a hot leaf means plant metabolism has shut down, a very bad sign.

Gentle air movement is one of the best ways to alleviate heat stress in your orchid collection. This keeps leaves from baking and burning if they get exposed even briefly to higher light and excessive

heat. If your plants are outside, try to find a spot that has natural air transport; you might be surprised at how variable microclimatic conditions can be even in a smaller yard.

## **Pronunciation Guide**

Pronunciation of orchid names can be daunting for the novice and experienced grower alike. This simplified pronunciation guide may help for the following orchids.

Dendrobium (den-DROH-bee-um) Epidendrum (ep-ih-DEN-drum) Lycaste (lye-KASS-tee) macrophyllum (mak-roh-FILL-lum) Masdevallia (mass-deh-VAHL-ee-ah) Miltonia (mill-TONE-ee-ah) Odontoglossum (oh-don-toe-GLOSSsum) Oncidium (on-SID-ee-um)
